You'll be aware that the Minister of Education Chris Hipkins announced the move to Orange yesterday. What does this mean for us? We're following advice from the Secretary of Education and will make our change to Orange on Monday of Term 2. While face masks are no longer mandatory at School, Public health advice is that masks are strongly encouraged when indoors. Wearing a mask is a crucial health measure that slows the spread of COVID-19 in indoor settings.

When do we wear a mask?

- · Visitors, parents and whānau, whenever you're on School grounds and if indoors
- When we have Assemblies indoors
- Students aged 12 and above using public transport
- If there are a high number of cases at our School or in the community. At this time, I'll use our usual ways of communication for any updates.

We'll continue to keep all other health measures in place at TPS that we know slow the spread of COVID-19. These include well-ventilated indoor spaces, maintaining good hand hygiene and cough/sneeze etiquette, appropriate physical distancing whenever we can and, most importantly, staying home if we are sick.




A learning-full term!

Sharing contact details and student information

We want to reassure our parents and whānau that we review outside requests for student information, to protect your privacy and confidentiality.

District Health Boards (DHBs) collect student information for lawful purposes connected with a function or activity being a health agency i.e., to deliver free dental services to students. DHBs will need to use a School 's roll to cross check their records to pick up non enrolments and to correct out of date details.

Year 7 and 8 Immunisation Programme 2022

Students in Year 8 will be given HPV1 Vaccination. This vaccination is given to girls and boys between ages 11 and 12. HPV vaccine helps protect against cancers caused by HPV.

Our School is scheduled to have HPV1 on: 17 May

Students in Year 7 are offered a booster vaccination against diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough to complete the New Zealand childhood immunisation schedule. This combination vaccine is called BOOSTRIX and can be administered at a School based vaccination programme or by your family doctor.

Our School is scheduled to have BOOSTRIX on: 17 May

If you wish your child to be vaccinated at School, please send the completed vaccination form to School.
