The School Based Immunisation Programme (SBIP) has now been scheduled across Auckland District Health Board catchment area.

Tetanus, Diphtheria and Whooping cough (Boostrix) for all Year 7 students

Human Papillomavirus (HPV Gardasil 9) for all Year 8 students
