Student Attendance

If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss a whole year of school by 16 years of age. As a parent or caregiver, you, alongside our school, play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance. All students are legally required to attend school every day and it is a shared responsibility to make sure students attend and engage in learning from when they first start school.

You must let the school know if your child is going to be absent for a day or intends to be absent for a portion of the school term for whatever reason, like a tangi or medical procedure.

If you're struggling at home with getting your child to school, talk to us! Our school is committed to supporting your child to attend school.

New Government Regulations - One hour a day of teaching core skills

All schools in New Zealand (Y0 - 8) will spend an average of an hour a day teaching each reading, writing and mathematics| pānui, tuhituhi & pāngarau. The Government wants to make sure that time is set aside to teach these core skills.

Class timetables at Tāmaki are all aligned to comply with this new initiative.

Cellphones at School

As you may be aware the Government has introduced regulations that require all schools to put in place school rules regarding the use of phones. The regulations require that schools must ensure students do not use or access a phone while they are attending school, including lunch times and breaks. Research indicates that phones in schools are not conducive for learning and for student well being. Therefore these regulations have been put in place to ensure that the learning of all students is maximised, while minimising any potential for distraction and cyber-bullying.

Tāmaki Primary School does not allow students to bring cellphones to School. These are not necessary to have during the day.

If a student is required to bring a cellphone to school for any reason, e.g. medical etc, request to bring the cellphone to School is to be made through the office and needs to be authorised by the Principal.

Parents and caregivers are requested to speak with their child about these rules and reinforce the expectations of the school.

Y7&8 Camp

This year Y7 & 8 students are going to Ngaruawahia Christian Camp on the 3, 4 & 5 April. Ngāruawahia is a very safe camping site situated about 20 minutes before Hamilton. Students will be participating in a number of activities like crate climbing, climbing walls, flying fox, archery, target shooting and waterslide. A great way to build whanaungatanga and Hauora.

Cluster Cricket Tournament

Y5-8 students have been practicing their cricket skills during lunch breaks. They will participate in the cluster cricket tournament on 20 Mar @ Ellerslie Cricket Club.

Communicating with School

Communication between home and school is vital. Many parents and whānau pop in to chat with teachers or leadership team when they drop off or pick up their children.
