Over the next few weeks, we will be focusing on lifting attendance right across the week. Here is what we are doing together as a kura:

- 1. Looking at patterns: We are checking our attendance data closely to understand why some days are lower. This helps us find real solutions and offer support to whānau who need it.
- 2. Celebrating the positives: When classes reach 94% or more for the week, we will celebrate with small rewards and shout-outs at assembly. We recognise the effort it takes to be here every day.
- 3. Working with whānau: If your child is away, you will get a quick text or call from us or even a door knock not to check up, but to check in. Sometimes a small bit of help with transport or uniforms can make all the difference.
- 4. Making Mondays matter: We are adding extra fun and hands-on learning to the start of the week, so tamariki look forward to Mondays as much as Fridays!

Let's keep our tamariki coming to school, on time. Every day matters, every learner counts.

Re: Notification of STRIKE Action - Thursday 23 October 2025

Kia ora e te whānau,

Friday 17 October 2025

You may have heard that members of the NZEI Te Riu Roa Union have voted to take strike action on Thursday 23 October 2025. Most of our teachers, support staff and myself are members of the NZEI. The decision to strike was not an easy one for us.

Why are we striking?

NZEI Te Riu Roa members are standing together because we believe our students deserve better. We are asking the Government for things like:

- More support for learners a teacher aide in EVERY classroom.
- Fair value for all school staff recognising the important work they do.
- Keeping great teachers and staff in schools so our children get the best education possible.

NZEI Te Riu Roa Union members across the country are giving up a day's pay to make this stand. We believe it will make a big difference to the learning and wellbeing of all tamariki.

What this means for you?

On Thursday 23 October, Tāmaki Primary School will be closed for instruction as the Board has determined that normal instruction cannot be provided during the strike, and for student safety reasons, the school will be officially closed for instruction. We will offer limited supervision for tamariki whose whānau may need support on the day. This acknowledges the collective action of our staff, prioritises student safety, and upholds our responsibility to manaaki our wider community.

We understand that strike action may cause inconvenience, and we truly appreciate your support. If this does create a serious problem for your whānau and you need support for child supervision on the day, please contact Sharon Williamson at admin@tamakiprimary.school.nz or 0800 527 6345 as soon as possible, so we can talk about how we can help.
