Successful Lockdown Drill Practice

Today, Tāmaki Primary School successfully completed a <u>lockdown practice drill</u> as part of our ongoing commitment to keeping our tamariki, staff, and visitors safe.

This exercise was designed to help everyone understand what to do in the unlikely event of an emergency requiring a lockdown, such as an angry dog being in the school grounds during break time. During the drill, staff and students followed instructions calmly and confidently, and all students and classes were safely accounted for within minutes. Our internal school emergency communication systems worked well, and everyone responded with care and cooperation.



We want to reassure our whānau that this was only a practice, and there was no cause for concern at any time. These drills are an important part of our Health and Safety procedures and help ensure that our kura community knows exactly what to do should a real emergency ever occur. We thank our specialist trainer Tammy from Harrison Tew, for your support.

School Lunches and Healthy Eating at Tāmaki Primary School
At Tāmaki Primary School, we provide nutritious, hot lunches every day
through the Ka Ora, Ka Ako | Healthy School Lunches programme. Each meal
includes a balance of protein (beef, chicken or legumes), vegetables and
carbohydrates and is designed to give students the energy and focus they
need for learning.





While many of our tamariki enjoy these lunches, we have noticed that some students continue to bring food from outside of school. In one class I visited recently, nine children brought packed lunches. Two had healthy, well balanced lunches made at home. The remaining seven lunches included crinkly packet foods such as chips, rice crackers, high-sugar fruit juice jellies, fried snacks, and biscuits — with only one child with fruit. In another class I was supervising during eating time, six children had chemical cordial drinks from dairy lunch packs.

We recognise that families do their best, but we also want to remind everyone that our school policy encourages healthy eating. Promoting a healthy food and

drink environment is vital for the wellbeing and hauora of our learners. Good nutrition supports brain development, concentration, behaviour, and energy levels, helping our children to learn and thrive.



We encourage whānau to make use of the free, healthy lunches available at school and to send only nutritious items from home when needed. Together, we can build positive habits and ensure our tamariki are well-fuelled for learning and play.

Sun Safety and Keeping Cool at School


The warm weather has well and truly arrived, and our classrooms are feeling it too! With temperatures rising, it is important that all students come to school prepared for the Auckland summer heat.



Please ensure your child wears a sunhat every day when outdoors. Sunhats are essential for keeping tamariki protected from harmful UV rays during break times and outdoor activities. We sell the school sunhat for only \$12 at the school office. It is attractive and covers your child's neck and face. Any sunhat will do though, it does not have to be the school hat.

We also ask that every child brings a reusable water bottle to school each day. Staying hydrated is vital for concentration and energy, especially in these warmer conditions. Our school has plenty of good Panmure water available for students to top up their bottles throughout the day.





Because of the hot weather and already warm classroom temperatures, school jumpers and jackets are not needed at this time. Please keep these items at home to help students stay comfortable and cool during learning time.
